Welcome to this issue of Grapevine. Time seems to have flown by since the last article and so much has taken place. Our Jamboree units have finally started their exciting adventure in Sweden and I have already received some great reports from the Contingent Leaders. At the time of writing this article both units had left the Jamboree site, Steve's unit have arrived safely in Latvia and Keith's unit have arrived in Poland. Most of our Districts have taken part in St Georges Day events and the AGM season has come to an end. We saw our own County AGM in May where many well deserved awards were presented to members of our County. We also saw presentations from Explorers and Network members who have recently completed their Explorer Belt Award taking part in expeditions across Europe. Len Gregory, the now Deputy Lord Mayor shared some of his experiences with us, which gave us the light hearted version of being a Lord Mayor. We also had the necessary business of an AGM including the presentation of our accounts. I will talk a little more about that later in my report.

I mentioned the Census in the last edition and I can report that as a County we were 0.8% up on last year's figures, thank you for your efforts in making this another year of growth within Scouting. We have seen a significant rise in female members which is good news. There is a lot of work to do around the recruitment of Adults to cope with the increase in numbers of our younger members. Rachel Jennings, our ACC Development, Paul Little and his team are working closely with the District Commissioners to tackle this problem.

Both County and Districts have some very exciting activities and events coming up as we look forward to the next twelve months. Our County events are beginning to fill up, Brumjam has begun taking bookings and Kandersteg is almost full. We have IceScout taking place in December and that too is beginning to take bookings. Leaders now need to get their sections booked in and support these excellent events. My diary is fairly full but if there are events that you would like myself or one of the County Team to attend then please drop me a line. Again well done to everyone for the magnificent programmes and events that have been organised and attended.

We have now finally filled the remaining two ACC Section positions and welcome Victoria Worship as ACC Beavers, Kris Hennegan as ACC Explorers. Kevin Fitzpatrick has taken over the role of Network Commissioner. All 3 are keen to get going and have some great ideas for the sections. I would like to take this opportunity to thank Tony Townley for all of his hard work within County and especially with doing such a magnificent job with the Network Section. I wish him well as he continues his work within Spitfire District.

The new Website is almost complete and I am hoping for some news later this month. The site has been tried and is just waiting for a few minor amendments.

The County Team are being given new email addresses to make it easier for our members to contact them, these will be going live shortly. Some of us are already changing over and I can be contacted on rick.keeber@birminghamscouts.org.uk. I said earlier that I would discuss the financial situation within the County. A Finance Strategy Group was formed in the last quarter of 2010 to look into the County's finances to try and identify how we can improve our financial health. In July of this year their findings, together with a number of recommendations were presented to the DC's, ACC's and County Exec. All GSL's should by now have received a copy of the presentation which shows that if we continue as we are then our cash reserves will have been exhausted by the end of 2012. The recommendations include improving financial accounting and cash-flow reporting, driving additional income from our assets, identifying sustainable sources of funding, restoring the reserves to an appropriate level and identifying ways of reducing costs. It was also identified that for each month that we take no action the County loses 3.5K. We have a number of options open to us, it is no secret that the majority of our income is used on staffing and a consultation process has started with our staff. Working groups will be formed over the coming weeks to progress each of the recommendations from the Finance Strategy Review and take forward proposals to the County Executive that will bring the County back into financial balance. Some of you may well be asked to sit on those Working Groups we will of course keep you updated and it is hoped that we will be in a position to release more information in September. As you can imagine we have had to make some difficult decisions, and we hope that everybody will understand the reasons behind the actions that we feel we're now compelled to take.

As you may be aware, the remit of Rachel's project has changed for this final year and she will be working with DCs and Districts to identify areas of growth, such as opening new sections and the occasional group where sustainability is possible. She will still be recruiting adults, but for specific purposes, so please remember to let your DC know any requests you have.

Paul's team of Development Advisors are working hard to support Rachel's targets for new groups and sections whilst also starting new projects with Rachel. These include providing more guidance when opening new groups and raising awareness of Scouting to communities whilst also promoting our open-to-all policy. All of which should lead to sustainable new groups and an increase in our numbers, our diversity and our social inclusiveness. We have other plans in the pipeline and look forward to sharing those with you in the near future.

If you would like to support the development teams in anyway then please get in contact with either of us. We are sure that the next 12 months will be a very exciting time for the development of Scouting in Birmingham.

Finally Rachel has been approached by Guide Dogs for the Blind Association who are celebrating their 80th year in October and are holding a week-long event. The theme is 80, and the Guide Dogs would like local Scout Groups to get involved to help celebrate this significant milestone. For some time now the county has been working on achieving an up to date register for Adventurous Activity Permit Holders. We have at last achieved this and the first draft went out a few weeks ago to DC's and the activities team.

This is a massive step for activities in Birmingham, this means now we know who holds what and can share this information to help run events and activities throughout the county. The DC's play a vital role in updating this register but at the same time its your responsibility to let your DC or a member of the activity team know that you hold or have achieved a adventurous activity permit. So please come forward and let your DC know if you hold a permit so they can check you are present and correct on the register. An updated register will be held by each DC and activity team member to achieve this.

Therefore from January 2012, if your name isn't on the Birmingham County register for adventurous activity permits you will not be covered by scouting guide lines, which means your permit will be invalid. This is why it's so important to act now so we can correct and update the register. We have a very strong team of advisers in many adventurous activities that will guide you through permit applications and will help you in any way they can.

What's in a flag?

A lot actually. As a Youth Movement Scouting is unique in its use of flags – for Church Parades, Investing new members, for all sorts of meetings it is used. It's a bit like an icon, as within its symbols and colours are enshrined expressions that we want to use to describe our unit, our Troop, our nation. They are important to us.

Sometimes, though, there are things missing on them! Most of us are aware that Wales is missing from our Union Flag! Now why is that? There is an obscure reason, but you can look it up, I'm not telling you!

I have reproduced for you an interesting flag that a member of my Church Community showed to me. It is a replica of a West India Regiment. You can see various symbols on it. My friend has written a book called "Why are West Indians in this country?" and in a loving way he reminds us that West Indians received a call to help Great Britain in tasks of employment and particularly in becoming allies in war – "The Wind Rush" you may have heard the name of the boat that arrived with the first pioneers of this special help. However the event of national and international importance is poorly recorded in our archives and it is good to put that right!

We hope to put that right, because it is so important to have these things "up front" just like the flag is! An exercise for youngsters is to design a flag representing them with symbols of their interests. Maybe include a family motto. It could be fun and profound at the same time!

And now a joke loosely connected to "George and the Dragon" – the symbol of England. A friend of the Pub landlord called innocently at the front door at an awkward moment! He had an angry wife's reception, but quietly enquired, "Is George in?"
